Eagle Village Campus provides academic support for residential students who live on campus. We work with a population of students who have academic deficiencies. We monitor student's progress toward program and individual goals, which include both academic and behavior. Reviewing data ensures implementing systems and processes are in place to provide support for all students. During the school year, student's improvements are shown on the NWEA assessments. There was an increase of intense behaviors in the second trimester. The student risk screening scale (SRSS) detects 87% of our students exhibit high internalizing and externalizing behaviors. Due to the intensity of behaviors, we have implemented weekly meetings to review data, and to create plans for our students. We provide support in a variety of ways for all students to achieve academic success. These supports include small and large

group interventions, supervised breaks, therapeutic walks, and movement breaks. Our team focuses on meeting student needs where they are upon entry into the program.

# Summary

Lighthouse Academy Juvenile Justice Institute is located in Holland, Michigan. We work closely with the Ottawa County juvenile court who ultimately place their students in this program. This is a daytreatment program, where students participate in programming during and as an extension of the school day. During the 2023-2024 school year at JJI, average attendance increased to 73%, up 8% from the average of 65% in 2022-2023. The day-treatment model has helped our average attendance improve, with attendance in court programs being affected if students miss a day at school. With the change to a day-treatment program, our interventions and responses to behavioral situations have been extremely individualized with a focus on restorative practices. There was one day in the first trimester where multiple significant incidents occurred resulting in 9 of the reported behavior incidents for the first trimester occurring on this single day. Throughout the year, we continued to see our behavior incidents trending lower than the first trimester. 50% or less of our students showed significant growth on NWEA MAP tests this year. We are working on having more resources to support these academic areas in advisory in order to help student growth in this area increase in the upcoming year. With the new day-treatment model, we have bi-weekly treatment meetings where school staff and court staff collaborate around students. During these meetings, we spend time discussing ways to best support students with attendance, academics, and behavior. We hope to see continued improvements in our data related to all of these areas as we continue these meetings throughout the school year.

The Pier provided high-school completion and special education services and programming to eligible individuals ages 15 to 26 during the 2023-2024 school year. Due to some eligible students with IEPs not being able to attend classes due to safety and security concerns determined by the community partner and/or had aged out of the general education eligibility (older than 22 years of age), our enrollment and attendance data do not match. Further, enrollment of students who received daily instruction is better represented by the average daily attendance numbers, which show a decrease in the number of students enrolled over the course of the 2023-2024 school year. This had an impact on the overall number of objectives, standards, and credits mastered and/or earned. Despite this, The Pier and our community partners, the Kent County Correctional Facility, celebrated four new graduates during the school year.


